SNOW EMERGENCY

The City of Menville has adopted a snow parking ordinance for the winter months. This Ordinance is to help get our streets plowed quickly and helps avoid personal property damage.

3-4-33 PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCY. No person shall park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle (including but not limited to cars, trucks, boats, trailers, campers, and all forms of recreational vehicle) on any public street, alley, or City-owned off-street parking area except as provided in 3-4-33A and 3-4-33B during any snow emergency unless the snow has been removed or plowed from said street, alley or parking area and the snow has stopped accumulating. Whenever an unauthorized vehicle is found, the authorized municipal officer shall cause the vehicle be towed.

A snow emergency parking ban shall continue through the duration of the snow or ice storm and the seventy-two (72) hour period after cessation of the storm except as above provided upon streets which have been fully opened.

The ban shall be of uniform application. The Chief of Police is directed to publicize the requirements widely, using available news media each year. When predictions or occurrences indicate the need to declare a snow emergency the Mayor or Mayor's designee shall inform the news media and publicize the parking rules under the emergency. Such emergency may be extended or shortened when conditions warrant. It shall be conclusively presumed that any snowfall of two inches or more as officially measured at Sioux City, Iowa creates a snow emergency.

3-4-33A DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS. Parking shall be permitted during a snow emergency in the designated parking adjacent to Haskell Pool and the designated parking on the west side of the 200 block of North Fourth Street for periods of up to seventy-two (72) hours of continuous use.

3-4-33B SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING PERMIT. The council may grant an emergency snow parking permit, for cause, in individual cases in which compliance would create an extreme hardship. When granted the permit shall be displayed upon the dashboard of the vehicle. All such permits shall expire May 1 of each year.

3-4-33C MUNICIPAL INFRACTION. Parking a vehicle in violation of this section four or more times between November 1 and May 1 or leaving a vehicle in a designated parking area in excess of seventy-two (72) hours shall constitute a Municipal Infraction. A civil penalty of \$100 shall be imposed for each such violation, each day a violation continues shall constitute an additional infraction.

WOODBURY COUNTY LIBRARY

There are physical books to check out as well as "bridges" an online resource where, once registered you are able to read books on your own e-reader.



If you have trouble finding a book just ask one of the ladies at the library, they are very knowledgeable and helpful! The library also has videos, magazines, cookbooks and cake pans you can check out.

During the school months Story Time is at 10am on Thursdays at the library. At story time they offer a story, snack and craft for participants. They always have fun!

Warmer months bring the summer reading program for area youth. For this program the library will pick out a theme and have suggested books for kids to read and track on a bingo sheet. At the end of the summer the library hosts a pool party and gives prizes for top readers. This summer the theme will be "A Universe of Stories."
