City Improvements

There have been notable City improvements around Moville that have residents excited. In front of City Hall on West Main was completely reconstructed. The street was over 100 years old with significant hollow spots and drainage issues underneath. In the future the City plans to update more of Main Street going East and add storm sewer infrastructure. Residents are familiar with the ice sitting on the South side of the street in the winter. Due to the lack of storm sewer water doesn't drain properly, therefore water/ice lingers. To get ready for the Main Street update the storm sewer needed to be improved on the West end first-where all the water will eventfully drain.

Another notable area in town currently under construction is the housing development by the "bus barn" area, Meredith Lane. The main portion of the street has been poured, next will be the addition of storm sewer. From there the developer will add homes.

Work on the sidewalk along Fair Street will take bids in July, construction will be determined by the contractor that wins the bid. We are anxiously waiting for the sidewalk to be construction to add another safe route for our residents to use go get around town.

City Reminders

With nice weather comes home upkeep and/or improvements. If you are working on your property and wondering if you need a permit, the following are times that permits are needed: new construction and additions as well as adding/updating/replacing fences and sidewalks.

When mowing or weed eating it is not permitting to mow clippings onto the street. Please make sure to keep them on your property or dispose of them properly. A great (and free) place to dispose of grass clippings is the Moville tree dump north of town.

Please remember trailers are not permitted to be on city streets for any length of time, just loading and loading.

FIREWORKS REMINDERS

Independence Day is right around the corner. With that, there are a few rules to remember when setting off fireworks inside Moville city limits:

- Discharge of fireworks are only permitted from 9am to 10pm June 1st through July 8th
- Fireworks may be discharged from 9am-11pm on July 4th and from 9am-11pm on the Saturday and Sunday proceeding and following July 4th.
- Fireworks are permitted on private property or on another's property with permission.
- Violation of the above rules can result in a citation and fine

Police Department Chief Muller asks that residents "be respectful of neighbors during this time frame.

Also, be sure to clean up any fireworks debris. We want everyone to have fun and enjoy being able to shoot fireworks, but there is a risk of laws being changed if we are not abiding by the rules of fireworks usage. Have a safe and happy 4th!"

MOVILLE FARMER'S MARKET





PET REMINDERS

There have been a few questions about pets in Moville. We have taken the top questions and provided information below.

<u>License</u>: Pets are due to be registered by May 31st of each year. Did you get a letter remaindering you to register your pet? If so, please complete the registration form, include a copy of current vaccinations and the fee. The late fees are as follows:

<u>At Large</u>: Pets running at large will be impounded. Owners will be required to pay a impounding and/or licensing fee before the animal will be released back to the owner.

<u>Nuisance</u>: Pets causing a disturbance by excessive barking or other noise making to such an extent as to annoy or disturb persons in the vicinity of the dog could receive a warning letter and/or Municipal Infraction depending on the number of occurrences of the incident.

<u>Animal Bites</u>: Any animal found to have bitten a person or other animal shall be confined as directed by the Mayor. The animal can then be subject to removed from the City and/or the owner can be fined.

If there are any further questions about any of the information please call City Hall or the Police Department if there are issues or concerns with animals that are at large, a nuisance, or dangerous.
