April 8, 2019

Opening prayer before lunch was given by Pastor Janet Rieckhoff-Faris. President Chris Countryman announced that the lunch was catered by Sneaky's Chicken. There were no guest introductions.

Old Business:

- Jeannie Krueger reported that before paying for today's lunch there is a balance of \$8,229.03.

- Moville News: On March 14, the community came together in response to the flood. There were volunteers, donation of supplies, and many town departments were available to assist where needed. FEMA will be setting up an office in Sioux City to offer assistance to those in need of low interest loans. City-wide clean up is underway. 20 loads were taken to the landfill last week. Many individuals are abusing the clean up days by putting things out that are not appropriate or don't meet the guidelines. A solution must be discussed to keep the clean up day from being discontinued.
- MCDAI: Kim Steffen reported that Trivia Night had the largest crowd yet. Still trying to attract someone to operate a grocery store in Moville.
- Flood Relief: Successful fundraising event at Mel's last night (steak fry). Jeannie Krueger made a motion to give \$1000 to the flood relief fund. Harold Werley 2nd.
