CITY ELECTIONS

City Elections will be taking place November 2nd at the Moville Community Center (815 Main Street). The polls will be open from 7am-8pm. This year there are two open seats for City Council and one for the Mayor position.

The process starts when individuals interested in running for the respective positions acquire an "Affidavit of Candidacy" and "Nomination Petition for Non-Partisan Office" papers. The candidate must garner at least 10 signatures from registered Moville voters; after those signatures have been received the documents are turned into City Hall by September 16, 2021 to be filed in the County Auditor's Office.

From there it is up to the voters to see who will serve as Mayor City Council members for the next two to four years.

The Public Works Department has a few projects they are working on wrapping up this fall.

Memorial Park will get new asphalt and ninety feet of parking mid October. Currently the guys are working on tearing up all of the old concrete at the park, that area will be closed to through traffic until construction is completed.

South Pearl Street will also get new overlay from George to Jones Street. We know this is an inconvenience for residents in that area, we appreciate your patience through this process.

Trees have been added at the MYRA soccer fields, Memorial Park and by the Haskell Pool with the assistance of the Tress Please! grant through MidAmerican Energy. We are very thankful to receive this grant again for \$1,000 to go toward adding tress in our community!

FLUSHING HYDRANTS

Hydrants will be flushed in Menville October 13th & 14th. The Menville City Crew flushes the hydrants two times a year-in the spring and fall. North of Main Street, including the Logan Addition will be done on the 13th, South of Main Street will be done on the 14th.

There are a few important reasons that hydrants are flushed:

- 1) To ensure all of the hydrants are working properly and there is adequate pressure available
- 2) To remove sediment from the pipes in order to maintain water clarity and quality in the distribution pipes

Q: What should I do after the flushing?

A: If the tap water is used during flushing, it could come out with sediment and discoloration. If you encounter discolored water, shut the water off and wait several minutes. After waiting, check for clarity by running cold water for a few minutes allowing new water to work its way into your pipes. If not, wait a few more minutes and check again. We recommend using a tub or outside faucet to clear the line. In some cases, you may experience slight discoloration for a few hours. This discoloration only affects the appearance of the water; it does not affect the taste or water quality.

Q: Why does the water look funny after hydrant flushing?

A: When a hydrant is opened, there may be temporary incidents of discolored water containing fine sediment particles. There is no health hazard associated with discolored water. Allow a few hours for discoloration to dissipate. To verify the water has settled, allow your cold water tap to run a few minutes. If the discoloration persists for more than twenty-four (24) hours, please contact our Public Works department 873-3545.

SIDEWALKS

There have been many questions that have come up with regard to side walks in Menville. Currently there is a sidewalk committee that has created a recommended time frame for sidewalk improvements throughout town. The committee is comprised of the Mayor, City Inspector, three Menville residents, two SIMPCO staff members and a member of Siouxland District Health.

During the Council meeting on September 15th those recommendations were presented to the Council for review and/or approval. After Council had an opportunity to review the suggested recommendations they decided to not to take action at this time, rather take the opportunity to research options further and seek community feedback. As always, residents are welcome to attend Council meetings to learn about topics in our community or voice their opinions.

UTILITY BILL OPTIONS

Did you know there are three options to pay your City utility bill? Online, ACH and in person at City Hall (or in the drop box on the East side of the building).

The link to pay your bill online by debit or credit card can be found on the City website (visitmenville.com). Just add your account number, follow the prompts and pay your bill online.
