Chamber officers decided to Incorporate and update the bylaws, etc. Beardshear has completed the paperwork, and now the organization operates as Moville Economic Development Corporation doing business as the Moville Chamber of Commerce with 501c3 Non-profit status. Every January, an annual meeting with elections will be held. Terms will be staggered – January 2020 elections for President and Secretary will be held. January 2021 Vice President and Treasurer will be up for election. These changes to the structure will allow more opportunities, including for grants, to the organization.
