### City Updates

Many projects are shaping up in Moville this spring, some are big and noticeable while others are smaller but still much needed. The City of Moville has been extremely fortunate to work with community members and the Woodbury Central School to see these projects come to fruition.

Memorial Park will see the biggest transformation-most notably the return of a skate park in Moville! A group of students from Woodbury Central looked into what it would take to get equipment back in Moville for a skate park, from there they made a request for funds for the project. After hearing about the project resident Cody Molland worked with the City of Le Mars to reuse some of the equipment the city was looking to surplus. The equipment that will be found at the park includes 16 foot box/ledge, pyramid feature and mini ramps. Once the equipment is set students from Woodbury Central School will help paint the equipment to give it a facelift and add vibrant color.

Not to be outdone the Woodbury Central Class of 1970 championed a project to add inclusive playground equipment at the park in memory of Chuck Logan. In the next few weeks rubber playground surface will be added to an area as well as equipment made specifically for individuals with disabilities. This will be a terrific addition to the park and a considerate way to memorialize Mr. Logan.

The Public Works Department have also had their hands in updating areas around town. A kitchenette was added at City Hall in the Council Chambers and a restroom was added in the south Fire Station.

The Haskell Pool and Memorial Park shelter house had the floors redone with epoxy to help esthetically and also for easier cleaning. The pool deck had concrete work done to level the area and fix cracks. The pool house ceiling was added and new lights were installed. pool also had concrete work done and both pools received new paint to freshen up the space.

We are looking forward to putting all of the updates to good use and we would appreciate the communities help to keep them looking nice and in good condition.

The 2021 season for the Moville Farmer's Market will start on June 3rd and will run through August 26th at the Main Street Pavilion. The Market will help kick off Moville Days and Security National Bank has graciously offered to host a free hot dog dinner that night from 5-7pm!

The Market will be open Thursday from 4:30-7pm with the exception of holidays and the week of the Woodbury County Fair (August 4th-8th). Some of the items that will be available this year will include but will not be limited to: fresh produce, plants, crocheted items, flowers, baked goods, body scrubs, goat milk products and much more.

Kids activities are also making a comeback this year! Due to COVID restrictions last season the y were not able to be offered. This season the Education Station will work with one of the local 4H groups to give kids the opportunity to learn about plants, animals and insects native to the area. The Power of Produce (PoP) Club put on by Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will also be back at the market! This is a Farmer's Market incentive program designed to empower children to make healthful food choices. The Pop Club will be at the Market June 24th, July 8th, 15th, 22nd, August 12th and 19th.

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

Moville City Council has a Building Inspector to handle most permits. Permits are available on the city's website, visitmoville.com under the City Hall tab or you can stop at City Hall and pick up a permit. Once the permit has been completed the form can be submitted to City Hall and the City Building Inspector will be notified. Please remember this process does take around ten days. If you are planning a construction project, be sure to calculate the time it takes the Inspector to do his job.

Permits are required for: **BUILDING**, **FENCE**, **REMODELING**, **SIDEWALK**, **REPURPOSING**, **HOUSE MOVING and OPEN GRADING PER-MITS**. Please call City Hall with any questions you may have with regard to building permits.

#### SPRING REMINDERS...

**Open Burning.** This is available for yard waste only and is scheduled for April 10th through 25th. ONLY during this designated time period are you allowed to burn yard waste. The City provides a yard waste dump site (for Moville residents) located southwest of the Nutrien facility; you may dispose of yard waste, branches and leaves at this location. Please take care to place the materials in the correct piles and do not leave plastic bags or garbage at the site. The tree dump is not for building materials/boards, etc.



- Mowing Do not mow grass clippings into the streets. The grass clippings clog the storm sewers and can causes sewer backups. It is expensive for both the city and home owner.
- •Weed/Mowing Complaints Grass and/or weeds need to be mowed by the 15th of the month from May through October. If grass and/or weeds are not mowed by that time the city crew will mow the yard. The fee for mowing and cutting weeds shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) per hour plus administrative fees, those fees will be assessed to the homeowner. See the newspaper for monthly notice.
- Operating Golf Carts Golf carts are allowed on city streets by persons possessing a valid driver's license and insurance. However, a golf cart shall not be operated upon Hwy 140. The golf carts need to have a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag and operate on the streets only from sunrise to sunset.

#### PET LICENSE REMINDER

Pets are required to be registered with the City of Moville each year. To register your pet provide a completed pet registration form along with a copy of updated vaccinations to City Hall, once those documents have been submitted tags will be provided for the current year.



Questions about the process? See below.

<u>License</u>: Pets are due to be registered by February 28th of each year (this is an updated ordinance with a date change). Did you get a letter remaindering you to register your pet? If so, please complete the registration form, include a copy of current vaccinations and the fee. The late fees are as follows:

<u>At Large</u>: Pets running at large will be impounded. Owners will be required to pay a impounding and/or licensing fee before the animal will be released back to the owner.

<u>Nuisance</u>: Pets causing a disturbance by excessive barking or other noise making to such an extent as to annoy or disturb persons in the vicinity of the dog could receive a warning letter and/or Municipal Infraction depending on the number of occurrences of the incident.

<u>Animal Bites</u>: Any animal found to have bitten a person or other animal shall be confined as directed by the Mayor. The animal can then be subject to removed from the City and/or the owner can be fined.

If there are any further questions about any of the information please call City Hall or the Police Department if there are issues or concerns with animals that are at large, a nuisance, or dangerous.
