

Public Works Summer Help Wanted

The City of Merville is seeking dedicated and motivated individuals to join its Public Works Department for summer maintenance roles. This entry-level position includes maintaining grounds across all city properties, trimming or removing trees as necessary, and performing additional duties as assigned. Comprehensive on-the-job training will be provided.

Preferred Qualifications:

Education: Must be 18 to apply.

Experience: Previous experience is advantageous but not mandatory.

Special Abilities: Strong organizational and scheduling skills, self-motivation, and effective communication are essential. The ideal candidate should demonstrate professionalism in interactions with the City Council and residents and possess the physical ability to lift up to 50 pounds, bend, carry, push, pinch, and pull.

Environmental Characteristics:

The work environment may involve exposure to extreme temperatures, odors, noise, dust, fumes, moving machinery, electrical hazards, burns, and potentially toxic substances.

Spring Clean Up

Moville residents can dispose of unwanted items from April 13th to 17th using two dumpsters available 24/7 in front of City Hall on Main Street (West end). This service is for Moville residents only—please follow the guidelines.

If you miss the dates or have unaccepted items, use the transfer station south of Moville. Hours: Mon, Tue, Thu, Fri 8am–4pm; Wed & Sat (from April 20) 8am–12pm.



Not accepted: household garbage, liquid paints, stains, sealers, automotive fluids, cleaners, building liquids, construction materials, pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, batteries, tires, and appliances (including TVs).

Operating Golf Carts & ATV/UTV's

Operating Golf Carts

Golf carts are allowed on city streets by persons possessing a valid driver's license and insurance. However, a golf cart shall not be operated upon Hwy 140. The golf cart needs to have a slow moving vehicle sign and a safety flag and operate on the streets only from sunrise to sunset.

Operating ATV/UTV's

Operating ATV/UTV's ATV/UTV's are allowed on city streets by persons possessing a valid driver's license and insurance. A reflective sign with an orange triangle and dark red border is required.



Hydrant Flushing Information and Post-Flushing Guidelines

Hydrant Flushing Schedule

Hydrant flushing will begin on Monday, April 20th and continue through April 23rd.

Steps to Take After Hydrant Flushing

- 1. Wait for Flushing to Subside**
Allow the flushing process in your area to conclude before using your taps. It is recommended to wait a few hours after flushing has ended in your neighborhood.
- 2. Clear Discolored Water from Your Home**
To remove discolored water from your plumbing, turn on a cold-water faucet, preferably in a basement sink or laundry room, and let it run for several minutes. If the water remains unclear after 10-15 minutes, wait another 15-30 minutes and repeat the process.
- 3. Check Faucet and Washer Screens**
If you notice low water pressure or reduced water volume, examine the screens on your faucets and washing machine. Sediment may have been collected during flushing and should be cleared out.
- 4. Addressing Stained Clothes**
If your clothes become stained due to discolored water, do not dry them, as heat can set the stains permanently. Rewash stained items promptly, using a stain remover or a rust remover for best results.

Important Information

- **Safety:** Water discoloration caused by hydrant flushing is safe to drink and does not pose any health risk.
- **Hot Water:** Avoid running hot water taps during and immediately after flushing, as this may draw sediment into your hot water tank.
- **Water Softeners:** If you use a water softener, you may set it to its "regeneration" or "cleaning" mode after flushing is complete.

Reminder: Using less water during hydrant flushing will reduce the likelihood of drawing sediments into your home.

Reminders



All pets within the City of Menville must be registered annually. To complete registration, please submit a filled pet registration form, documentation of current vaccinations, and the appropriate license fee to City Hall. Upon receipt of these materials, pet tags for the current year will be issued. The registration fee is \$10 per pet for those not neutered or spayed, and \$5 for neutered or spayed animals.



Please keep the park clean by properly disposing of trash, recycling when possible, and leaving no litter behind. Everyone's cooperation is important to maintain the beauty and health of the park for future visitors.



Grass and/or weeds need to be mowed anything over 10 inches. If grass and/or weeds are not mowed by that time the city crew will mow the yard. The fee for mowing and cutting weeds shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) per hour plus administrative fees, those fees will be assessed to the homeowner. See the newspaper for monthly notice.
