

Moville Chamber of Commerce Annual Meeting Minutes

October 11, 2021

The opening prayer was given by Lisa Fouts.

President Chris Countryman thanked Yellow Rose Catering for today's meal. Guests today included Brayden Coulter and Father Randy Schon from Immaculate Conception Church

Old Business:

- Treasurer's Report: Balance of \$14, 190.10 after today's meeting.

- School News: Superintendent Glackin reported that the middle school gym is waiting on the flooring. Bus barn and parking lot are completed. Bus barn will not have doors at this time – requirements must be met according to the fire marshal. Dallas Kluender received the Student of the Month award.
- Moville News: Most buildings have been winterized, fertilizer and seeding has been done in the areas where construction has taken place. New asphalt will be put down in Memorial Park and South Pearl will receive new overlayment.. Chris Countryman reported on the recommended changes to the flood plain area which would impact most along Frontage Road.
- MCDAI: The organization donated \$100,000 to the medical clinic project. Also, the vet clinic (going into the old grocery store) is being remodeled at this time.
- Moville Area Medical Committee: Diane Drevs reported that they applied for the \$1,000,000 grant through Missouri River Historical Development – they have a meeting with MRHD on October 20th as the next step in the application process. Other grants have been applied for as well. Jeannie Krueger made a motion to give \$10,000 to the project with Pam Clark 2nd.
- Nominations: Jeannie Krueger (Secretary) and Jodi Peterson (Vice-President) terms office will up for election at the end of the year. No nominations were received. Jim Fisher made a motion to keep Jeannie and Jodi on the ballot for the same positions Stee 2nd. Members were encouraged to seek other nominations for those positions.
Elections will be held in December.

New Business:

- American Legion Chili Cook-Off : October 30 at Senior Center with a bake sale . Teams are needed – cost is \$5/team. There will be a free will offering for chili for the public. Proceeds support the cemetery flagpole project.
- Fall Fest 2021: Sam Thomas recognized and thanked the many businesses, organizations and individuals that played a part in making the event a success. Encouraged everyone to come next year to see what it's all about.
