- City News: Jim Fisher thanked those in attendance for his re-election. Crews are busy with winterizing projects. Work has started on the new lift station at the 4-Way stop. The old lift station was 40-50 years old. City Hall will undergo remodeling to increase efficiency. The office will be open but relocated to the conference room during the project. Megan and Jim attended a conference.
- Halloween – Attendance was down, but leftover food was donated to the Community Basket and the Senior Center. Approximately 432 kids this year. It was suggested that maybe a sign could be put up at the end of the Halloween parade to invite people to the supper at the park.

New Business:

Get businesses linked to the city's website- contact Jodi to do so. Upgrade business facades and possibly run Christmas lights along the business front outline.
